

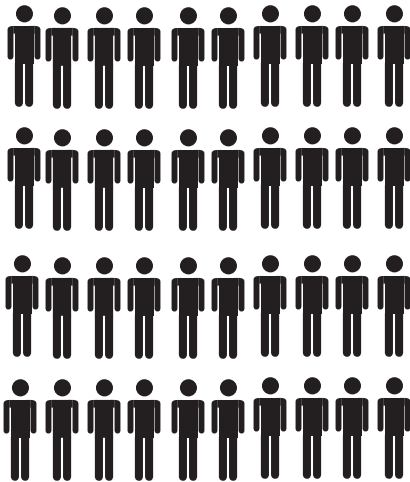

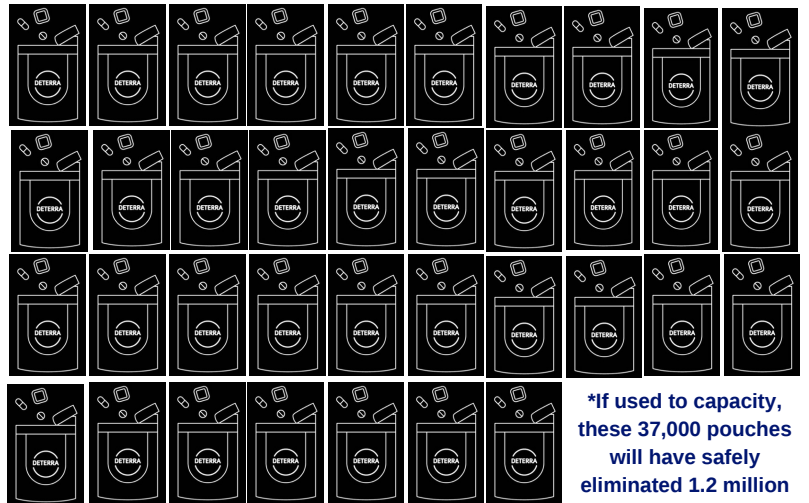

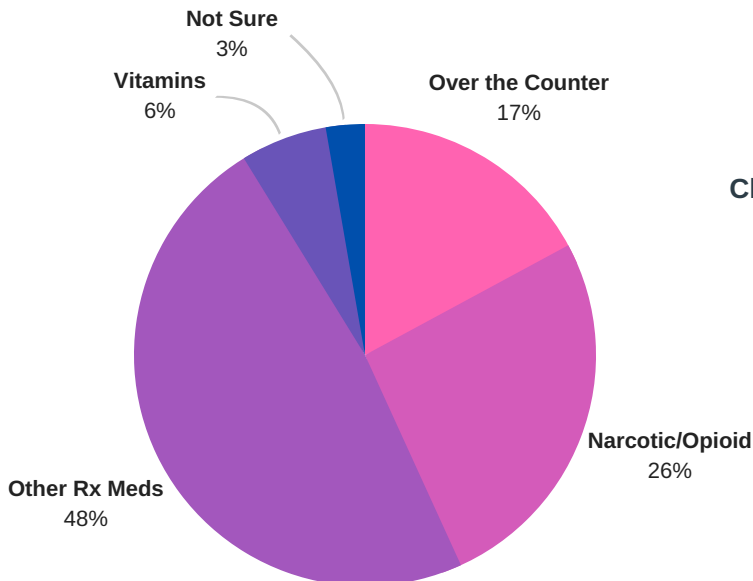
### 37,000 POUCHES DISTRIBUTED\*



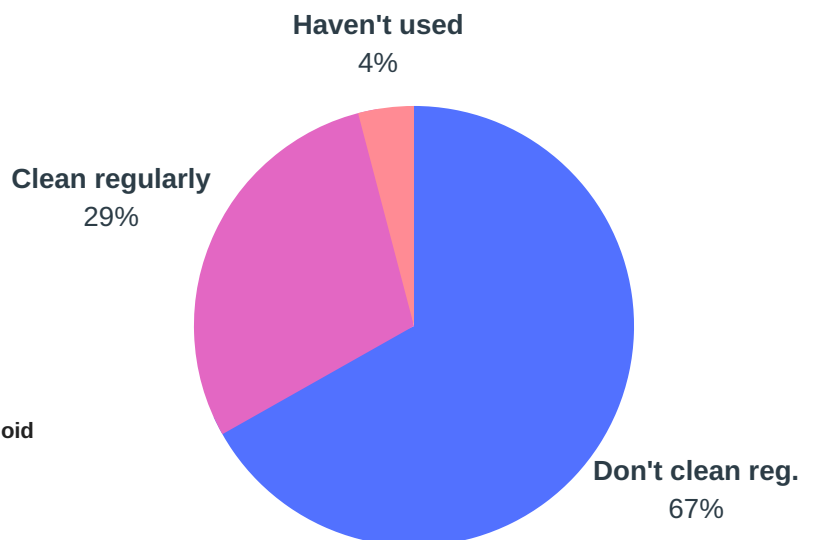
\*If used to capacity, these 37,000 pouches will have safely eliminated 1.2 million pills and an estimated 323,000 opiates, according to survey data

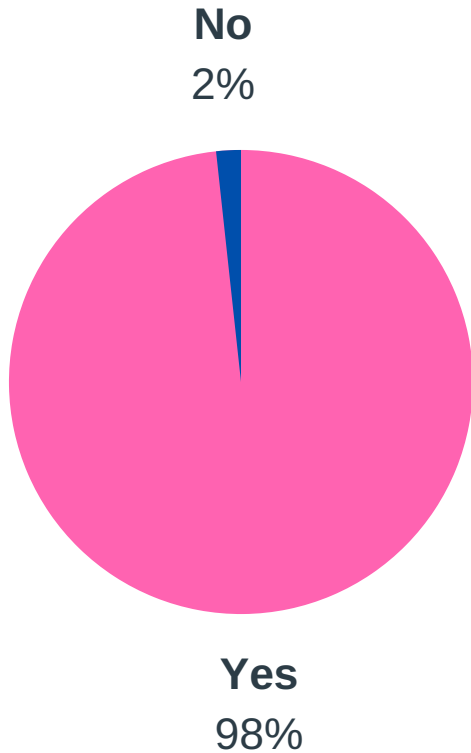
#### What types of medicine did you dispose of? \*\*

## Was the pouch easy to use? \*\*

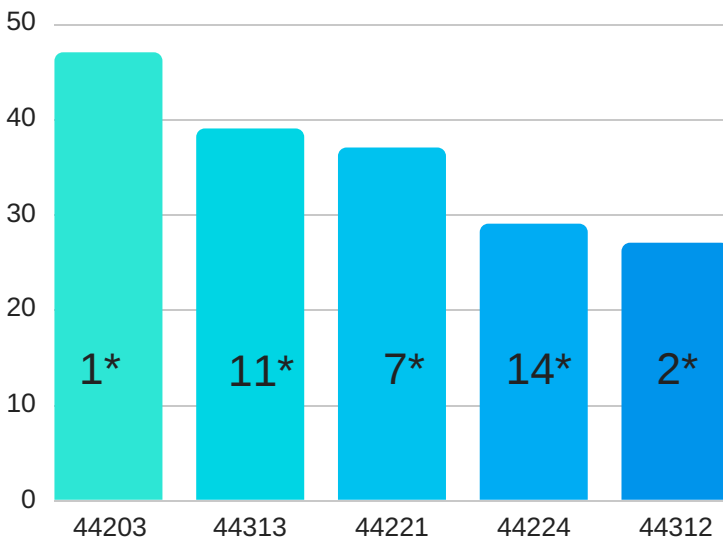
